Ellen Clark also lost her mother in the past year and we know it is a great sadness to the whole Clark family.

Bryan Harvey, son of the father of the Tullis – Len Harvey - and owner of the Lebar Stud in Zimbabwe died unexpectedly in the course of 2010. Unbeknown to us his wife Cherine was suffering from cancer and sadly died on 20 January 2011, a few days before the wedding of their son Devlin! We are extremely sad that all the Harveys, except for brother Don, who played such an important role in the development of the Tullis are now deceased. Cherine and her children were put off their farm within weeks of Bryan dying. This fact prompted them to dispose of the famous Lebar Herd very soon after. Hindsight now makes us realise that Cherine's declining health must have added to the urgency of the disposal of the herd – so sad!

Peste en Plae

Veediefstal deur tweeënige diewe is nog meer frustrerend omdat dit so dikwels maak dat mens jou eie staf en selfs jou bure begin verdink en dis nie 'n aangename gevoel nie! Die Vermaaks (Haresia Stoet) van Stoffberg het onberekenbare skade gely toe 51 van hulle dragtige koeie soos mis voor die môreson verdwyn het. Hulle plaas is plek-plek taamlieke onherbergsaam en hulle kry nie elke dag kans om die vee te kontroleer nie. Toe hulle begin soek en niks vind nie – en nou, byna vier maande later steeds geen teken van die beeste opgespoor het nie moes hulle hulle maar met die groot verlies versoen. Geen spore, geknipte drade of enige leidrade tot op hede nie! Geluk by die ongeluk is dat dit darem nie die Tullis is wat gesteel is nie maar kommersiële koeie! Ons innige simpatie, aan die hele Vermaak familie! Van so 'n slag herstel mens moeilik!

Nearly all of us have **lost cattle due to lightning** but Wilna Ackhurst, who farms on the cold, high ridges outside Belfast has probably lost more animals than most – ten sale bulls on one occasion some 6years back but on average three or four animals every year. Deaths by lightning have been in the news regularly this summer and many experts have been discussing the phenomena and giving advise:

Only 30% of all lightning actually strikes the earth – the rest happens within clouds and from one cloud to another. Although it is seriously alarming to note that at the height of the summer rainfall season more than a million bolts of lightning strike South Africa per month keep in mind that that is only 23% of the strikes that hit a small village called Kifuka (most struck in the world) in the DRC. Pity them!

Lightning bolts are known to travel horizontally for 30km or more before striking the ground. That means any storm that can be seen on the horizon, or heard to growl, is a potential killer. South Africans spend a lot of time outdoors and not always by choice. Travelling on foot or working in flat fields mean many are caught far from shelter when storm clouds gather.

Many more find themselves in informal or traditional dwellings, which provide little protection from lightning. Thatch roofs tend to catch fire when massive amounts of electricity are poured into them, while lightning can spark from corrugated iron shed walls to a human body. Interesting too, is the fact that a column of smoke from a cooking fire or 'braai-lapa' together with the rising heat produced by the fire act like a lightning rod and actually attracts lightning. Another reason why rural areas record more deaths from lightning is the fact that they lack the underground network of pipes and wires that make city ground such a good, and safe, conductor.

When lightning hits the earth its energy radiates away from the impact point, with the electrical charge dissipating as it goes. Put two or more objects in that line of travel but a small distance apart, say the two legs of a human or the four of an animal, and the juicy flesh in between becomes the easiest path of travel for an electrical current. Electrical engineers refer to this as step potential. If you are caught out of doors in a storm it is advised that you make yourself as small as possible by hunkering down flat and keeping your 'footprint' compact to avoid the step potential – sadly this advice won't help our four-legged animals!

Then there is the streamer effect: The most common lightning we see, about 90%, is negative-downward lightning. There is a negative charge that travels down towards earth,

moving under its own steam in the classic zigzag pattern. According to Ian Jandrell from Wits, it is invisible until it makes contact with the earth, and we get the flash. As it gets close to the earth, positive streamers start going upwards to connect to it. Objects such as trees, pylons, people and animals reach out to that charge on its way down from the clouds (one hears someone saying – “I felt my hair stand on end”) Think of it as a race in which the bodies of people and animals participate. If the positive streamers emanating from them lose the contest it collapses back into their bodies -- with nasty consequences.

Like step potential, the streamer effect can kill entire groups near a strike, and higher surrounding structures don't always afford protection. One of Wilna's neighbours had four sheep struck dead by lightning – he was upset by the original loss but horrified when two months down the line more than fifty of his pregnant ewes, who had been in the vicinity of the deadly strike gave birth to dead lambs or died themselves because of birth complications!

As can be seen from the above conventional wisdom about how to avoid getting struck and where you would be safe unfortunately does not always work.

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Back into Africa - Completing the Circle

A group of 11 Tuli bulls left South Africa on 23 November 2010, headed for Zambia. After an exhausting journey of more than 1700km they finally arrived safely on the farm Millimani Estates at a place called Landless Corner about 70km north of Lusaka. Five bulls belonging to Stephan and Carmen Welz, five bulls belonging to Vincent and Nellie Beukes and one bull belonging to Wilna Ackhurst were bought by four Zambian Breeders and a Consortium. After four weeks in quarantine at Embryo Plus in Brits they left South Africa, crossing the Limpopo at the Groblersbrug Custom's Post into Botswana. Authorities in Zambia would not allow the animals to travel through Zimbabwe, the most direct route, because of animal health issues in that unfortunate country. Travelling north through Botswana via Francistown and Nata they finally crossed the Zambezi into Zambia at the Kazungulu Ferry. Fifty-five hours after leaving Brits they were safely offloaded on Megan Landless's farm for another period of in-house quarantine. They were all pretty hollow looking by that time, took a few hasty bites of grass and then made a beeline for the water.

We are delighted that our animals have gone back north into Africa to replenish the Tuli genetics in Zambia - in a manner of speaking, completing a circle started in the 70's with the first exports south from Zimbabwe to South Africa. Megan's husband Ron started farming with Tuli many years ago and when he died she decided to continue with the Tuli's as a tribute to his memory. Chris and his brother Phil Rogers were involved with Tuli in Zimbabwe for many years. Tuli from their Koce or HT (also incorrectly known as HYN0; HYLO; etc Stud) were amongst the first imports to South Africa and were also imported for our joint National Sales in 1997, 1998 and 1999. Like so many others they lost their farm to land-grabs and Chris now lives in Zambia while Phil is in Botswana. Malcolm Ross is a new breeder who became involved with Tuli through the infectious enthusiasm of both Megan and Chris. Some of their neighbours have also bought some of the bulls and we wish them all the best of luck.

Their tenacity and resolve in embarking on this Import venture can only be attributed to the old saying 'fools rush in where angels fear to tread. The problems and ramifications presented by such a venture boggles the mind – and I speak from personal experience! Hats off to all of them for persevering but especially to Chris Rogers who had to cope with most of the logistics.

Prestasie toetsing – Performance testing

'n Klein bietjie advies

Wanneer u u speengewigte deurstuur na die LNR is dit belangrik om die volgende te onthou: Die gewigte van kallers van eerste kalf verse en koeie tot en met vyf jaar oud word aangepas met soms soveel as 14kg. Koeie tussen 5 en 10 jaar oud se kalf gewigte word glad nie aangepas nie en dan word koeie ouers as 10 jr se kallers weer effens bevoordeel. Met dit in gedagte kan mens kies om jou eerstekalf verse in 'n aparte groep te verdeel. Jy kan dan natuurlik ook jou 5-10jr oud koeie in aparte groepe indeel. Onthou ook dis baie belangrik om diere wat dieselfde behandeling gekry het saam te groepeer bv, 'n groep koeie wat in 'n bergkamp gewei het se kallers moet liefes saam in een groep wees terwyl 'n ander groep wat byvoorbeeld op aangeplante weiding geloop het se kallers weer in 'n ander groep ingedeel moet word. Hier is daar egter 'n baie belangrike voorwaarde en dit is dat groepe nie te klein moet wees nie – indekse van groepe kleiner as 10 diere se betroubaarheid kan met soveel as 60 persent afneem.

Ricardo Martinez uit Argentinië

Tussen Maart en Junie 2010 het lede van die Genootskap vir Ricardo Martinez op hulle plase ontvang. Soos in die Joernaal berig was Ricardo, 'n jong veearts, op besoek aan Suid Afrika vanweë sy belangstelling in Tuli. Die Katolieke Universiteit van Cordoba waar hy studeer het, is van die voorste instansies in Argentinië wat navorsing oor die Tuli gedoen het. Hulle het dan ook 'n kruisbeesras, die San Ignatio, ontwikkel met die Tuli as belangrike komponent. Sy besoek het vir ons heelwat publisiteit gebring in bv die Landbou Weekblad en Ricardo het ook fluks gehelp by die Tuli stalletjie by Nampo. Hy het by 'n paar geleenthede 'n interessante Powerpoint aanbieding gedoen en sy innemende persoonlikheid het almal wat hom ontmoet het bekoor. Net waar hy gegaan het het ons lede hom uit die boonste rakke getrakteer en ons wil net weereens almal wat betrokke was van harte bedank. Op verskeie plase het hy homself nuttig gehou waar hy kon en het 'n groot verskeidenheid Tulitipes onder elke denkbare boerdery kondisie gesien. Verdere hoogtepunte van sy toer, volgens hom, was 'n besoek aan die Krugerwildtuin, die geleentheid om by twee telers vir die eerste keer 'n bok te kon plattrek en 'n paar trofee horings terug te neem Argentinië toe en dan veral om die bakermat van die Tuli te besoek. Hy was nou wel nie in Zimbabwe nie maar in die Tuliblok in Botswana by die baken op 'n eilandjie in die Limpopo waar

die drie lande, Suid Afrika, Botswana en Zimbabwe bymekaar kom - die area waar ons Tuli se voorsate in alle waarskynlikheid vandaan gekom het (Sien ook die artikel in verlede jaar se Joernaal oor Mapungubwe).
