2. Technical

2.1 Al Bulls & Embryo Cows

Members will receive a letter regarding the guidelines for AI bulls and Embryo cows. There is a need for AI bulls in the commercial market. Council will investigate the matter further to identify bulls.

2.2 Cancellations

Animals sold to commercial farmers, must kindly be transferred and not cancelled, to ensure a non-member buyers list for marketing purposes.

2.3 Management Book

The management book is currently being revised and members will receive the new book electronically as soon as it is available.

2.4 Genomics

The AGM 2021 decided that the genomic profile of the Tuli breed must be developed. The Southern Africa Tuli Federation was founded and funding from AU-lbar for Genomics, marketing, etc was promised. Due to these promised funding, Council postponed the project by not spending any funds. Council is currently in serious discussions with the AU-lbar and hope to give feedback soon. Council already identified animals for this purpose. If the outcome regarding funding was not positive, members will receive a letter regarding the subsidy and the tail hair samples that should be collected.

2.5 Herd Sires

During the previous Council Meeting held on 16 & 17 February, Council decided that all Herd Sires should be sire verified and genomically tested. This item and date of implementation will be discussed further at the AGM.

2.6 Parentage Verification

SA Stud Book will nominate members. The Society will only pay for the positive results. If there is errors, the member will be held responsible for the costs involved.

2.7 Logix open

Logix will remain open for non-members on the current level. Non-members that want reports and more information should contact the breeder directly.

3. Fund Raising

3.1 Wine Auction & Hunting Packages

Members are heartily thanked for the generous sponsorships of the wine acution lots, as well as the hunting packages. Until the Tuli inspection form is completed, members must use the inspection form with rejection codes and the default setting of 12 must be changed by hand to 18 for the bulls.

7.6 Promotion to Senior Inspector

Junior inspectors must take note of the procedure to be promoted to a senior inspector:

Promotion is not automatic. A Senior inspector(s) with whom you have inspected, must recommend you to council to be promoted to a senior inspector.

The rules are as follows:

- 1. Firstly the junior theory- and practical examination must be completed successfully.
- 2. Then you must complete at least three inspections with a senior and WHEN he/ she is satisfied, then he/ she may recommend you to council as a senior inspector.

This may take from ten to 100 inspections.

3. After a positive council decision, you again have to complete a practical examination successfully, after which you will be a full-fledged senior inspector.

Thereafter you must attend at least every second practical course and physically participate, to maintain your status as a senior inspector.
